

# Studio Pottery

## ABOUT THE CLASS:

Whether you're currently potting or haven't touched clay since high school, this directed studio class may be for you!

**Students will be encouraged to:**

- **set individual production goals** to improve basic clay technique: wheel, handbuilding, or both. *What do YOU need to brush-up on or finally master?*
- **sharpen her/his awareness of the elements & principles of design** from actual construction to final firing. *Why did that pot look so good before it was glazed?*
- **discover the "art" of clay in both functional and sculptural pieces.** *Yes, that morning coffee mug really can be a work of art! How?*
- **study and research the techniques and work of contemporary potters** through current publications, books, and internet resources. *No term papers required, just interesting browsing and learning!*
- **learn the "language" of clay through the art of critique.** *How do we discern and talk about what's "good" and why?*

## ABOUT THE STUDIO:

The Art Museum's Ceramics Studio was redesigned and reorganized this year to provide students a more flexible and productive space for working with clay. The arrangement allows for ease working with both porcelain and stoneware, and also provides space for recycling clay. Designated areas for glazing, wheels, handbuilding/sculpture, and storage have opened up the studio space, which we hope will open up more options for your pottery experience!

## ABOUT THE INSTRUCTORS:

Jeff & Jane Boswell have a 35-year history with teaching, with clay, and with each other. Jane taught pottery at Jefferson High School; Jeff, also a single teacher, signed up for her adult education class, and the rest is history. Both have done graduate work in pottery and have enjoyed exhibiting and selling their work.
